

Non-Allowables

Here's a short list of items that can't be shipped by your mover

Before your possessions are packed and loaded, it is important that you understand which items cannot be shipped because they represent a hazard or are perishable.



HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: ITEMS THAT ARE FLAMMABLE, CORROSIVE OR EXPLOSIVE

Examples

Listed are some common non-allowable items



- Aerosols
- Gasoline
- Nail polish/remover
- Ammonia
- Household batteries
- Paints/Paint thinner
- Ammunition
- Kerosene
- Pesticides
- Car batteries
- Lamp oil
- Poisons
- Charcoal/lighter fluid
- Liquid bleach
- Pool chemicals
- Cleaning solvents
- Loaded guns
- Propane tanks
- Fertilizer
- Matches
- Sterno
- Fireworks
- Motor oil
- Weed killer

PERISHABLE

PERISHABLES: FOOD, PLANTS OR LIVING THINGS THAT MAY DIE OR SPOIL IN TRANSIT

Examples

Listed are some common perishables

- Frozen food
- Produce
- Open or half used foods
- Refrigerated foods
- Plants
- Carbonated beverages
- Pet food
- Other living things

For shipments moving less than 150 miles and delivered within 24 hours of pickup, carriers may agree to transport perishables that are properly packed and require no servicing in transit.

Note: You should empty your refrigerators and freezers and keep appliance doors open for at least 24 hours in advance of loading. This will allow the appliance to dry out and prevent growth of mold.

Don't wait until "move day" to deal with perishable items around your home
